At her wit's end, Andrea recently walked through our doors again. The last two years have been particularly tough on her and her family. Andrea, who has an autoimmune disease, is now seriously ill, unable to work, and short on food and rent again; she doesn't know how much longer she and her three children can survive living like this. Remembering the dignity and respect she received the last time she came to Beverly Bootstraps, she finally decided to call her old case manager.

With the recent end of eviction and utility moratoriums in Massachusetts, all Andrea can think about is where she and her children will live if she's unable to catch up on her back rent and they are evicted. The possibility of being on the street with three kids and no home during the coldest months of the year terrifies her. She needs your help.
