

# STAMP OUT HUNGER



### We couldn't do it without you



With another tax season in the books, Beverly Bootstraps is fortunate to have a very talented group of volunteers that help make our Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (V.I.T.A.) program possible. The team's dedication is essential to providing this valuable tax assistance to low-income families across the North Shore. With fewer organizations in the area providing free services this year, clients were especially thankful for the assistance.

Doug\*, one of our clients, had recently spent almost a quarter of his salary on his real estate taxes. He shared that his daughter has been helping him financially. He arrived anxiously for his tax appointment, fearing he owed money that he did not have. Our preparer helped Doug file tax returns for

the past three years. Doug was able to apply for the Senior Circuit Breaker tax credit, and his anxious demeanor turned to joy as he was told he would be receiving money back and did not owe anything.

"Thank you for helping me. You made me feel comfortable, and I know I am in a safe and trustworthy place to get help. I am grateful for you." expressed Doug as he left. He wanted us to know of the gratitude he felt to the many donors who gave to make this tax program and all our other services possible.

Altogether, our talented group of volunteer tax preparers prepared and filed 410 tax returns for clients living across the North Shore. With their help, our clients had nearly \$608,000 returned to them, valuable money that often goes towards helping to pay for groceries, rent and utilities.

To echo Doug, we are so thankful for the continued support of donors and volunteers like you who give your time and treasures to make programs and services like this possible in our community. Together, we change lives.
